



Trojmezí Accessibility card

Description

Trojmezí is a place where the borders of 3 states meet - Czechia, Poland and Slovakia. It lies in the picturesque Beskydy countryside, in the territory of the villages Hrčava, Jaworzynka and Čierná at an altitude of 568 m above the sea level. It consists of a shared border stone, which is located in a stream bed and three granite monoliths with coat of arms of individual states. From the Polish side it is possible to reach Trojmezí by car by the asphalt road. From the centre of Hrčava there is a marked footpath for Trojmezí (approx. 2 km along the yellow trail), which can be followed by a round trail to Jaworzynka in Poland and back to Hrčava (5 km long).

Accessibility

Entrance - access way to Trojmezí

- Access to Trojmezí is possible from the Czech and Polish sides. To get by car to Trojmezí from the Czech side, it is necessary to obtain permission from the local authority Hrčava. In winter, the road is impassable. There is no need for permission from the Polish side to get to Trojmezí.
- Access road from the Czech side: paved road with asphalt and gravel surface. Part of the section consists of concrete panels. Descent up to 15% on a stretch of about 0.9 km and then a climb of 9% on a stretch of about 0.8 km. Transverse slope greater than 2%.
- Access road from Polish side: road with asphalt surface. Decreasing 15% on a strech of about 180 m, without a greater lateral inclination.

Exterior premises – area Trojmezí

- Trojmezí is a place in the outdoor area, which is freely accessible.
- From the place where the access road meets from the Czech and Polish sides, respectively from the parking near Trojmezí, there are stairs with wooden railing leading to Trojmezí (106 steps with 26 landings, step height 15 cm, interlocking pavement surface). Staircase width: 145 cm.
- A pathway was built along the steps without stair treads with an asphalt surface and wooden railing.
- Pathway width: 110 cm. Length: 90 m. Longitudinal gradient: 16%. The pathway leads to the Polish monolith.
- ❖ A footpath leads through the meadow to the Czech monolith.





Accessible toilet

There is no toilet available.

Services and equipment

- Guide or registered assistance dogs are permitted entry.
- The place is freely accessible and it is not serviced by staff.
- Parking on the Czech side of the car park before entering the village Hrčava (2 km from Trojmezí), without reserved parking spaces. On the Polish side there is a car park at Jaworzynka Trzycatek bus stop, with one reserved parking space (1 km from Trojmezí). There are about 4 places at Trojmezí without reserved parking places. It is only possible to access them from the Polish side.
