Description

The Liberec Zoo was founded in 1904. It is the oldest zoo in Czechia. More than 150 animal species are kept on an area of almost 13 ha. Among the most interesting breeds are hamadryas baboon, barbary lion, red panda or very popular white tigers. The guided tour is approximately 1.7 km long. In addition to animals, the zoo also offers relaxation zones, attractions for children, snacks, souvenir shop, etc.

Accessibility

Entrance

- The entrance to the Zoo (from Lidové sady Street) is wheelchair accessible.
- ❖ Entrance door is min. 80 cm wide and it opens automatically. There is no threshold.
- Access to a ticket office is wheelchair accessible.
- Entrances to all pavilions are wheelchair accessible.



Interior premises – interiors of pavilions

- The pathways in pavilions are min. 150 cm wide and there is sufficient space for the movement of a person in a wheelchair (wheelchair rotation) or a pram.
- Doors and passages are min. 80 cm wide.
- The surface of the access ways is solid and non-slippery. Material: mostly tiles, except for the monkey pavilion and tropical pavilion, where bark is placed on the floor in summer.
- On the pathways, thresholds / steps are not higher than 2 cm.

- ❖ Most of the pavilions are ground-floor, two-floor buildings, except for the giraffe pavilion, where is a platform and a tropical pavilion (access to the second floor is with barrier stairs).
- Resting places are located only in the Elephant and Giraffe Pavilion.
- Information panels and exhibit labels are well visible both from sitting and standing position. They are written in Czech.

Exterior premises

- The routes in the outdoor area have a firm and flat surface (without major defects), without height differences higher than 5 cm and without stairs that could not be avoided. Material: mostly concrete and asphalt.
- Routes are min. 150 cm wide.
- ❖ The Zoo complex is in hilly terrain, which corresponds to the route profile. There are more difficult sections with a slope above 6%, especially between the higher and lower parts of the Zoo.
- There are information and orientation boards that are easy to read and understand. The information is provided in Czech, English, German and Polish.
- There are seating areas for resting in the premises.



Accessible toilet

- There is a wheelchair accessible toilet in the premises.
- The toilet door is min. 80 cm wide and it opens outwards.
- Toilet dimensions are at least 160x160 cm.

- Next to the toilet is a free space for a wheelchair (at least 90 cm wide), which does not interfere with any equipment (waste bin, sink, baby changing unit, etc.).
- There are handles on both sides of the toilet.
- ❖ A baby changing unit is available.



Services and equipment

- ❖ In the premises there are: a souvenir shop (wheelchair accessible) a coffee bar, a restaurant (wheelchair accessible) and a confectionery (barrier access 2 steps, opened only in summer with service on the outdoor terrace).
- ❖ Visiting the Zoo is possible without a prior agreement.
- Guide and registered support dogs are permitted entry.
- Possibility of renting a wheelchair for people with limited mobility.
- Possibility of renting a printed version of the guide list to the Zoo in Braille. The guide contains the most important animals in the Zoo.
- Playground and children's corner (without a babysitting service).
- A visitor train available.
- Reserved parking places available.
