Description

The museum has several departments: ethnographic, historical, archaeological, art and educational one. Here you can see an ethnographic exhibition that shows the monuments associated with the culture and folk art of the Głubczyce region - everyday items, household appliances and agricultural equipment. The archaeological exhibition presents monuments from random findings in the Głubczyce region and archaeological research. The historical exhibition presents sights describing the history of the Głubczyce region from prehistoric times to 1945 (period of World War II). The art department exhibits works of art from the fields of painting, graphics, sculpture and crafts. Guided tours take place in groups or individually. The museum also has a viewing tower from which you can observe the Sudetenland and the Carpathian mountains. The museum offers themed lessons.

Accessibility

Entrance

- The museum is located in the Town Hall. The exhibition halls (permanent exhibition) are located on the first floor. Temporary exhibitions are held mostly on the ground floor, in the premises of ancient shops from the 13th century.
- The entrance to the Town Hall building is wheelchair accessible. Entrance doors are min. 90 cm wide. The best access to the wheelchair museum is from Emilie Plater street (at the Paradiso pizzeria / cafe). There is an outdoor ramp, which leads the visitor to the entrance and a lift inside the building.
- The entrance to the museum on the first floor is also wheelchair accessible. Entrance doors are min. 90 cm wide. The first floor is accessible by stairs (with handles on both sides) or by lift. The area in front of the entrance is flat, with dimensions min. 150x150 cm. The entrance to the lift is min. 90 cm wide, the elevator cabin has dimensions min. 110 (W) x 140 (D) cm.
- Entrance to the exhibition halls on the ground floor (ancient shops): stairs.
- A viewing tower: access through spiral concrete stairs with handrail on one side, high step and narrow doors at the entrance to the viewing platform.

Interior premises

- All pathways in the building (in the permanent exhibition area) are min. 150 cm wide.
- Doors and passages are min. 80 cm wide.
- The surface of the pathways is firm and non-slippery. Material: ceramic tiles.

- There are no thresholds / steps on the pathways.
- There are seating areas for resting in the exhibition area.
- There is sufficient area for movement of persons in a wheelchair (wheelchair rotation) or a pram.
- The exhibits and information panels are positioned so that they are clearly visible both from sitting and standing position. The labels are in Polish.
- Most of the exhibit can be viewed from close distance.
- Stairs and uneven stone surfaces are on temporary exhibitions. There is an 18th century Głubczyce model, which is also available in electronic version on the museum's website.

Accessible toilet

- The wheelchair accessible toilet is located on the 1st floor. The key is available at the museum office.
- The cabin door is min. 80 cm wide, without a threshold.
- The door opens outwards (from the cabin).
- Cabin dimensions are min. 160x160 cm.
- Next to the toilet there is a free space for a wheelchair (at least 90 cm wide), which does not interfere with any equipment (waste bin, sink, baby changing unit, etc.).
- There are handles on both sides of the toilet.
- A baby changing unit is not available.

Services and equipment

- The visit is possible without a prior arrangement, however larger groups of people in wheelchairs are requested to provide information about the planned visit in advance to the museum office (tel. +48 77 485 01 93).
- Guide or registered assitance dogs are permitted entry. There is a dog drinking bowl available.
- The Museum recommends a guided tour for people with visual impairments. The museum does not have any touch models or audio guides with descriptions for the blind. Exposition labels are made in large and readable letters.
- Guided tours of the museum are in Polish.
- Touch screen station provides history of the museum and its surroundings, including photographs.
- Virtual tour available on the website.
- Parking at the entrance. The car park has 1 reserved parking space.
- Induction loops are not installed in the object.
- Audio guide for foreign visitors is not available.
